Home for the Holidays?
Last Christmas, 7 families with 14 children stayed at the shelter.

In an average week:

- 10 families will stay in the shelter.
- DVS will provide legal advocacy, court accompaniment and support to 34 new clients.
- 8 clients will be served in daily protection order clinics held at a courthouse.
- Support services such as rental assistance, food box, 911 cell phone, and counseling services to another 5 clients will be provided.

On an average day:

- 26 phone calls on 24-hour crisis and informational line will be answered.
- 16 women and children will be housed.
- 13 loads of laundry and dishes will be done.
- Clients will prepare and eat 48 meals.
- 8-10 rolls of TP / paper towels will be used.

In 2009, DVS...

- Provided emergency shelter for 376 domestic violence victims and their children (172 women, 204 children, and 2 men).
- Provided 6,023 bednights.
- Answered 8,384 calls on our 24-hour crisis line.
- Saw 2,081 visits to support groups.
- Provided legal advocacy to 1,623 clients.
- Assisted with 373 protection orders.
- Provided over 4,500 advocacy and group counseling hours.

They gave us everything we needed – shoes, clothes, food, went to court with me. It was the first time that I had felt safe in a long time."
