As you prepare for the annual ritual of spring-cleaning and to mark Earth Day on April 22, Domestic Violence Services of Benton & Franklin Counties (DVSBF) is asking community members to dust off those old cell phones you no longer use and donate them to a worthy cause.

In collaboration with DVSBF, all Yoke's Fresh Markets in the Tri-Cities area and the Grocery Outlets in Kennewick and Richland, Washington accept donations of no-longer-used wireless phones for this campaign in support of DVSBF, which benefits domestic violence victims. The Cell Phone Donation Drive runs from April 22nd through May 21st.

Used wireless phones (from any carrier) are refurbished, recycled or sold, and either phones or cash are donated to our local domestic violence shelter for use by survivors. Older, unsalvageable phones are disposed of through an EPA-certified salvage company.
